AUTHOR (if available – last name, first name). ARTICLE TITLE (if available) in quotation marks. TITLE of web site underlined. Date of publication or update. Date of access URL (<Web site address in angle brackets>.) Click on "Backspace" or "Delete" once to remove any hyperlinks immediately after they appear.

Cite as you would any other Web page, but make sure you're crediting the original creator of the image/sound/video clip.
